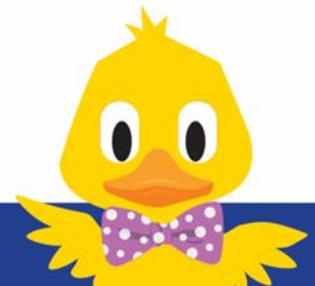

- Entry Confirmation Form MUST be produced.
- All vehicles MUST be off site by 11.15am on Friday 25th August.

EXHIBITORS MUST PRODUCE THEIR COPY OF THE ENTRY CONFIRMATION FORM:

- To the Convener or Steward on arrival at the exhibition hall and on collection of exhibits and prizes on Monday 28th August between 8am – 11am and 3.30pm – 6.30pm.
- THERE WILL BE NO SUNDAY COLLECTION.
- Sponsored cash prizes will be paid via EFT.
- Exhibits and prizes will not be released for collection without the Entry Confirmation Form being produced.

Growing Plants

GROWING PLANTS – OPEN

1. The Plant must be established in pot or container in which it is shown
 2. All exhibits must be the property of and grown by Exhibitor or have been in their possession for six (6) months prior to the show date
 3. All pots to be clean
 4. Unless otherwise stated, pots no larger than 200mm inside measurement at top
 5. Plants larger than 350mm in diameter must be stated on entry form. Maximum 500mm bench space
 6. Watering of growing plants to be limited so that when staged, wetting/staining of table does not occur
- Infected or infested plants WILL NOT be exhibited – These will be isolated

EXHIBITORS PLEASE INDICATE ON ENTRY FORM DIAMETER AND HEIGHT OF LARGE PLANTS

IF DIAMETER AND HEIGHT IS NOT STATED ON ENTRY FORM EXHIBIT MAY NOT BE STAGED DUE TO INSUFFICIENT ALLOCATED SPACE

GROWING PLANTS IN BLOOM – OPEN (ORCHIDS EXCLUDED)

- • Maximum size of pot not to exceed 200mm (8”) inside measurement
- • Plants must be established in pot, box, receptacle in which it is shown
- • Plants should carry name tags where possible

Cacti & Succulents

1. Plants must be established in pot, box, receptacle in which it is shown (no Double Potting)
2. All exhibits must be the property of and grown by Exhibitor or have been in their possession for six (6) months prior to the show date
3. All pots to be clean
4. Flower spikes are encouraged, plants should be clear of debris
5. Plants larger than 350mm in diameter must be stated on entry form. Maximum 500mm bench space
6. Watering of growing plants to be limited so that when staged, wetting/staining of table does not occur

Please Note Infected or infested plants WILL NOT be exhibited they will be isolated from the other plants

 - Maximum size of pot not to exceed 275mm (11") inside measurement
