Swing of the axe returns to the Show

IT might look easy enough, but the sport of woodchopping is a serious test of strength, agility and timing.

The Mallee Axeman's Association will have members give a woodchopping demonstration over both days of the Gawler Show – an attraction that always draws a crowd.

Among them will be association president Michael Dreckow with 19-year-old son May

"We will give some commentary as we go, demonstrating a vertical stand and an underhand horizontal one," Michael said.

"It's not something you see everyday, especially these days."

Michael grew up on the family farm in the Mallee region, east of Eudunda, where wood chopping was always the done thing.

"My grandfather supplied wood to Adelaide during the war years, so we always grew up swinging axes and

splitting stumps, but I hadn't really thought of competition chopping until a good friend of ours talked us into it," he said.

"We had a go, my brother and myself, that was around 1985 and I've been at it ever since."

Fellow member, and former state representative in woodchopping, Nathan Schulz, said the Association likes to get around to a handful of regional and country shows each year.

"People love it – it's a unique sport," he said.

"Everyone loves watching it and asking questions, which is good because it gets the sport out there."

Nathan has been woodchopping since he was seven, having grown up watching his pop Barry Schulz swing the axe competitively.

"There's definitely a skill to it and there's a sense of satisfaction that comes from it as well," he said.

"I've been doing it for as long as I can remember and I still don't think I've perfected the skill."

The woodchopping demonstration will be set up on the Show's Village Green, with the Mallee Axeman's Association giving demonstrations at 11.30am and 1.30pm on both days.

The Valiant Order of Historical Entertainers will bring their combat skills and history display to this year's celebrations, showcasing the medieval marvels of all cultures.

Legio XII Fulminata will also be bringing their army to the Show with a marvellous display of Roman history.

"Highly disciplined, well organised and fearsome, the Roman army was arguably the greatest military force in world history. Nothing embodied the might and efficiency of the ancient military more than the Roman Legion," they said.

The Lightning Twelfth (Legio XII Fulminata) was established by Julius Caesar, and was named after the unit's symbol – the lightning bolt displayed on their shields.

A small cohort of the Twelfth will be at this year's Show, and are keen to share their interest in Roman history and the Legion with the community.

Fans of all things medieval will be treated to a weekend of sword fighting and combat, along with themed displays during the festive weekend.

Sheep to get shorn

BAAS will add to the sounds of this year's Gawler Show, with a sheep shearing demonstration a new addition to the Show time line-up.

Jonathan Liebelt, of Jono's Sheep Shearing Services, has been shearing sheep since he was a kid and in between running his own business, enjoys sharing his skill and know-how with others.

He will be running regular demonstrations over both days of the Gawler Show, accompanied by work dogs Hazel and Kelly who also know how to entertain.

"The shows go for about 20 to 30 minutes and we do the sheep dog component first, talking about how sheep dogs work and how they interact with the sheep," Jonathan said.

"They are very friendly dogs, so everyone loves giving them a pat and asking questions about them and they always love seeing how the dog interacts with the sheep, as well.

"Then we do the shearer component and we also talk about the wool and how the sheep goes about growing

that wool back for the next 12 months.

"So it's the whole process of bringing a sheep in and shearing them."

Jonathan grew up on the family's cattle farm at Littlehampton and showed an interest in helping out with the sheep early on.

"We used to have a man by the name of Frank Jacobs who used to come in and shear sheep for us and as a young kid of about 12 or 13 years old I thought that was quite interesting, and so he taught me one day," Jonathan said.

"He took me out to shearing sheds and it sort of expanded from there.

"Now I have a full sheep shearing business I run all year round doing hobby or small commercial property sheep shearing across most of SA."

Jonathan's experience includes two years giving sheep shearing demonstrations in the theme parks, on the Gold Coast, and these days he enjoys getting around to country and regional shows.

Animals remain popular stars of the Show

THE Gawler Show's Agricultural Learning Centre is back bigger than ever, but with the same goals of inspiring the next generation to care about our Aussie animals.

One of the main attractions will be an appearance by wildlife education service Animals Anonymous, which will showcase some of South Australia's most endangered animals while sharing a thing or two about conservation.

Former Adelaide Zoo keeper Dianne Pearson runs Animals Anonymous with partner Adrian Sherriff and said inspiring young people is a hugely rewarding experience.

"Australia's wildlife is very underrated," she said.

"Mostly when you ask a child what their favourite animal is they'll say a lion or a tiger and I don't think Australian wildlife is showcased enough, so that's what we try and do with Animals Anonymous. "We try and get children,

and even adults, interested in animals they might not have known before.

All the animals brought along by Animals Anonymous have been hand-reared to be friendly with people - some that may come along to the Gawler Show include a python, goanna, monitor, glider and a Tawny Frogmouth.

"We talk about a Bettong and a lot of people might not have heard of that species before, and they've got the chance to get up close and pat them," Dianne said.

"It sort of develops a connection and hopefully a better appreciation for that animal, and when that child grows up they might have an interest in conservation and then that builds."

The Agricultural Learning Centre (ALC) will also welcome back chicks, guinea pigs and rabbits for kids to cuddle and pat, as well as the interactive team from Bugs N Slugs with their impressive display of creepy crawlies.

2023 is an appearance from the Bee Society, as

and ALC coordinator Bec Bolton said she is excited for what the ALC will bring to the Show.

"It's a great opportunity for people to get outside have the opportunity to interact with different animals," she said.

"And with it expanding and becoming more educational it means they can actually see, for example, that bee keeping is an easy thing to get involved in that's

"I think for the students it provides them with a great sense of community and that community connection," she said.

"It gives them that responsibility and provides

them with an experience that has transferable skills in a professional way, so they can practice those skills that are awesome for future employment.

The Agricultural Learning Centre is located within the sheds at the northern end of the showgrounds and also forms part of the free Nixon's Animal Adventures

Hope for the Future

The farm comes to the Show

FOURTH-generation dairy farmer James Krieg is passionate about people understanding the connection between the farm and the food they eat.

At this year's Gawler Show, James will be putting on a free dairy demonstration for young families, where kids will get an insight into where milk comes from.

"I'll bring a cow along and kids will be able to get up close to her and give her a pat," he said.

"They'll get to see her be milked and hopefully have a go at it themselves."

James manages a jersey herd on his family's farm at Kangaroo Flat, where milk is sold to be processed into cheese for Adelaide pizza shops.

He also runs education sessions for school students and young families, in a custom-built on-farm classroom.

Kids meet the cows and see and

experience milk being turned into cream, butter and even ice-cream.

James said drawing the connection between food and the place where it is produced is the main goal.

"Kids just love coming out to the farm and seeing the calves," he said

"I hope to give a taste of what I do at home at this year's Gawler Show."

In 2022 James was crowned Gawler Show Rural Ambassador, and will be representing the Northern Agricultural Shows Association in the Rural Ambassador state final at the Royal Adelaide

His dairy demonstration will be held in the Agricultural Learning Centre, with multiple milking sessions to be run over both Saturday and Sunday of the Gawler Show.

Trail of treasures

At just \$5, bags can be collected from the Gawler Show tent over the Show weekend or be pre-purchased online (at gawlershow.org.au).







At this year's Gawler Show, Boomstars will be joined by a whole line-up of entertainment aimed at the youngest showgoers.



THE Gawler Show's sideshow alley and rides will be the place to try your luck and make memories to last a lifetime.


The arena of both old and modern-style carnival fun is brought to the Gawler Show each year by the Showmen's Guild.

LONG before the rides rolled in and the show bags went on sale, the Gawler Show was a showcase of creativity and ingenuity.

From its early beginnings, nearly 170 years ago, the Show acted as a friendly exhibition and competition of agriculture, horticulture and floriculture.

In 2023, the competition is alive and well.

There are 25 main sections of competition, from the more traditional, like livestock, cookery and art and crafts, to the modern ute muster, photography and scarecrow contests.

All ages take part, with competition entry fees waived for school groups.

EACH year there is a grand way to finish off a bumper weekend of Show time activity.


The Gawler Show's Grand Parade is one of the last things to see, as it makes its way around the showground's main oval, from 3pm on the Sunday.
