SHOWDAY:

Below are step-by-step instructions to guide you through the process of using the Showday Online competitions entry platform.

1. Creating an Account:

- If you're a first-time user, click on the "**LOGIN/REGISTER**" button located in the top right-hand corner of your web browser. If you are entering via a mobile device or tablet this button may appear as "**LOGIN**"
- **Create an account**
- Enter a valid email address.
- Create a password with a minimum of 8 characters.
- Fill in the required details and click "**CREATE AN ACCOUNT**".
- NOTE 1: You only need to do this once; next time you will log in as a returning user.
- NOTE 2: Please ensure you enter students Year and School Name prior completing create an account section

2. Logging in:

- Users who have already created an account should "**LOGIN**" with their email address and password.
- If you've forgotten your password, use the "**Reset my password**" option and follow the instructions supplied.

3. Selecting the Event:

- Ensure Country is changed to "**AUSTRALIA**" in top right corner
- After logging in, you should automatically be taken to the Gawler Show event page.
- If the Gawler Show event page does not automatically appear, select "**ALL EVENTS**", "**SELECT LOCATION**" as "**SOUTH AUSTRALIA**" then select "**GAWLER SHOW**" as the event you wish to enter
- "**PROCEED TO ENTRIES**"
- Click the "**PLACE AN ENTRY**" red button to make a group entry, then "**SELECT CLASSES**"

4. Group Entry:

- Enter the Year level and Name of School and list all exhibiting students under “name of entrants”
- **“SELECT CLASSES”**
- Select **“SCHOOLS”** using down arrow function NOTE: **DO NOT** select individual sections at this point - you **MUST** go through the **SCHOOLS** section first
- Pop up will appear – section notes
- Check box “I have read and accept the section notes”

5. Selecting Classes:

6. Entering Details:

- Expand the Section by clicking the **“+”** sign to see the Section’s Classes
- Click the circle next to the Class you wish to enter

7. Finalising Entries:

- Once you’ve selected all classes for one section, choose to **“ADD ANOTHER ENTRANT”** if needed or click **“FINISHED ADDING CLASSES”**
- **“ADD ANOTHER ENTRANT”** will take you back to Step 4
- **“FINISHED ADDING CLASSES”** will take you to **“SELECT EXTRAS”** and additional notes
- Select any **EXTRAS** you may wish to purchase and click **“FINISHED ADDING EXTRAS”**, or
- Skip the **EXTRAS** screen by selecting **“FINISHED ADDING EXTRAS”**

8. Payment:

- Tick “I have read and agree to the terms and conditions” box,
- Select your payment method - enter payment details
- **“PAY NOW”** – please be advised that while all school entries are free you will be charged a \$2 admin fee

1. All Exhibitors must be bona fide owners
2. All Entrants to be Named and Stud Identification Stated on Entry Form
3. All Bulls to be tied in allotted stalls
4. Handlers to remain in attendance at all times
5. All Cattle must be tagged with an approved NLIS RFID Ear Tag.
6. Sponsored Prize Money/Vouchers will be available on the day of competition
7. **ENTRY FRIDAY** - All competitors and ALL other persons in the vehicle must have an entry ticket to the Gawler Show) including children under 5 years (free ticket) - **entry via Gate 1 ONLY**

3. No late entries will be accepted.
4. Exhibits may be rejected if they do not meet the criteria (Junior classes not included)
5. Exhibits incorrectly entered may be transferred by Convener/Steward to a suitable class before judging.
6. With the exception of Decorated Cakes, Judges will cut and taste every entry.
7. All entries to be exhibited on appropriate size white paper plate or covered board where required, in CLEAR plastic bag (Oven Bag or clear zip lock bags). NO Glad wrap or supermarket vegetable bags.
8. Every entry to have exhibit number attached. Entry Label is to be attached to the top front edge of the plate (not on clear plastic as this is removed for judging)
9. **SALE OF CAKE PROHIBITED IN HALL**
10. Please do not put names or any identifying information on the exhibits.
11. All reasonable care of Exhibits will be taken however no responsibility will be accepted for loss or damage.

JUDGING TIPS

1. Definitely no cake cooler marks on any cakes. No testing marks in centre. (Skewer to be placed diagonally through side of cake to check if the cake is cooked through.)
2. All sponges to be exhibited on paper plate or suitable board covered with greaseproof paper.
3. NO alfoil or plastic (cling wrap).
4. Biscuits must all be evenly baked top and bottom.
5. Scones to be evenly coloured, not to be leaning over, no floury bottoms.
6. Take special note of the instructions re the number of small cakes and biscuits required.
7. All exhibits to be made by the exhibitor.
8. Round cake tin 20cm unless otherwise specified.
9. NOTE: All exhibits in this section must be homemade (no packet cake).
10. The judge will look at whether the exhibit meets the class requirements, appearance, texture as well as taste.

Our vision is to recognise and reward those appreciators and supporters through an amateur wine event, where you will gain invaluable support from local experts

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY:

- The competition is open to all Amateur Wine Makers.
- Only “Amateur” or “Home Made” products may be entered. All entries must be submitted in the name of the maker.
- Judging will take place prior to the Show.
- Each entry shall consist of two standard (750ml) bottles OR (375ml) bottles, appropriate to the class being entered. Both bottles must each have the entry label attached.
- There is no limit to the number of entries each Exhibitor may submit, except that no entry may be entered in more than one class and similar entries in the same class must be identified on the Wine Description Chart (ie: Vintage or Variety of Fruit).
- All entries are to be listed on the General Entry Form AND then must be thoroughly described on the accompanying Wine Description Chart.
- The Convener and/or Judges may disqualify an entry if he/she and/or they consider it has been falsely represented. Any disqualified entrant may have all their entries disqualified from the competition.
- Exhibitors shall be bound by the decisions of The Gawler Show Society, Convener and/or Judges and no disputes shall be entered in to.
- The Gawler Show Society, Convener and Judges will not be held responsible for the loss of or damage to any entry. Nor shall they be responsible for any entry being entered in the wrong class or improperly labelled.
- All competitors shall receive feedback / tasting notes.
- The Gawler Show Society reserves the right to make any changes to this program and any prize money should they be deemed necessary.
- No identifying information should be attached to the entry. Only the label with the entrant number and class number should be visible to ensure blind and fair judging.
